Note

One of the worst decisions in boxing history in terms of victory margin and identity of winner is confirmed by the statistics. Young outlanded Ali by more than 100 punches, connected on 51% of his power shots and slammed Ali's body 149 times (27 jobs, 122 power connects), more than the 113 times Ali connected in all phases. Interestingly, Ali landed 33 body shots (all power shots) and in the 13th he landed 11 alone. He couldn't reach Young's head so he went for the flanks just to hit anything. Norton and Cosell was pleading with Ali between rounds to pick it up but it wasn't enough -- except to the people who counted most. Young's habit of ducking his head under the ropes resulted in a standing knockdown in the 12th, which certainly didn't help his cause. Still, a very dubious decision that reeked of political and financial considerations.
